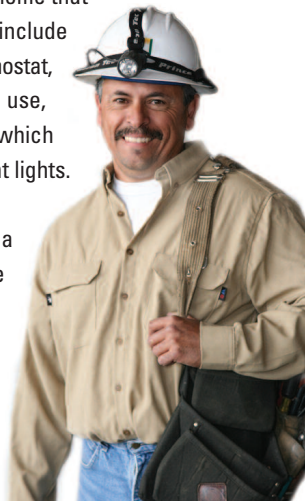

Medical Baseline **Allocation**

You or a full-time resident in your home may qualify for a Medical Baseline Allocation, which gives customers additional electricity at the lower “baseline” rate for specific medical life-support equipment and specific illnesses or conditions.

SCE customers who depend on electrically operated life support equipment for survival should have a back-up power system or a plan to ensure health and safety during power outages.

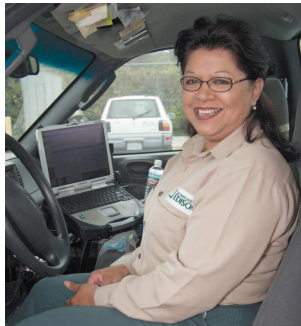


Safety Tips for Stormy Weather

The weather outside may be frightful, but downed power lines can be deadly. During heavy wind and rain storms, power lines can fall to the ground creating a safety hazard. If you see a power line on the ground, stay away from it whether it's sparking or not. Call SCE at (800) 611-1911 to report the location and then contact the police and fire department. If you should lose power:

- Use flashlights rather than candles, since they create a fire hazard
- Keep one light on to signal that power has been restored
