Fall into **safe habits**

Cooler weather means keeping cozy at home – without sacrificing safety. You can help prevent electricity-related injuries and damage with a quick pre-winter safety check of your home. Here are some tips to get you started:

- Look for cracks in the cords to your electric blanket or heating pad. If it's cracked, throw it out!
- Never "tuck in" an electric blanket – trapped heat quickly becomes a fire hazard.
- Keep small space heaters at least 3 feet away from curtains, clothes and furniture.
- Make sure your heater has an automatic turn-off feature in case it tips over.
