

TOU-8 Rate Schedule

Flexible and Economical

Southern California Edison's (SCE) Time-of-Use General Service — Large (TOU-8) Rate Schedule is a flexible, customized rate designed to help you use energy more wisely, and save money for your business.

TOU-8 serves commercial and industrial customers, including large manufacturers and processors, supermarkets, colleges and universities, hospitals, and office buildings.

TOU-8 is mandatory if your monthly registered demand is greater than 500 kilowatts (kW). Depending on the times of day you use electricity, TOU-8 may help reduce your energy costs. Service under TOU-8 is subject to meter availability.

TOU-8 has four rate structures:

- Option A (TOU-8-A)
- Option B (TOU-8-B)
- Option R (TOU-8-R)
- Critical Peak Pricing (TOU-8-CPP)

Special, binding conditions apply.

TOU-8-A

If you participate in Permanent Load Shifting (PLS) by using certain technologies to move electricity usage away from peak times on an ongoing basis, or cold ironing pollution mitigation programs, you are eligible for TOU-8-A. TOU-8-A has no Time-Related Demand Charges, but has higher energy charges during on-peak periods.

TOU-8-B

This is the base rate for all customers with electricity usage above 500 kW. TOU-8-B has the following basic charges:

- Monthly Customer Charge — covers a portion of basic services, such as meter reading and customer billing
- Energy Charges per kilowatt-hour (kWh) consumed — varies by season and time of day

- Demand Charges — consist of Time-Related Demand and Facilities-Related Demand charges

The Time-Related Demand Charge is applied only during SCE's summer season. It is a per-kW charge applied to the greatest amount of registered demand in each summer season billing period.

The Facilities-Related Demand Charge is also billed on a per-kW basis, but it is effective in each billing period throughout the year. It is applied to the greatest amount of registered demand in each billing period. This charge is necessary to recover costs for the installed transmission and distribution facilities required to serve your highest demand during the year.

TOU-8-R

You are eligible for TOU-8-R if you have annual peak demands lower than four megawatts (MW) and install, own, or operate solar, wind, fuel cells, or other eligible renewable technologies as defined by the California Solar Initiative (CSI) or the Self-Generation Incentive Program (SGIP). Compared to the other TOU-8 rate structures, TOU-8-R has no on-peak or mid-peak demand charges. It has a lower Facilities-Related Demand Charge, but higher on-peak and mid-peak Energy Charges. TOU-8-CPP

If you are eligible for TOU-8-B, you are also eligible for TOU-8-CPP, which offers benefits for shifting or reducing electricity use during critical peak events in the summer season.

If you are a bundled service customer (who receives electric power, transmission, distribution, billing, metering and related services from SCE), you will first be served under TOU-8-B for an interim 60-day period, then moved to TOU-8-CPP on your next regularly-scheduled meter read date after that 60-day period. You may also choose TOU-8-A, TOU-8-B, or TOU-8-R, or another applicable rate during that same period.

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If you are a Direct Access customer transferring to bundled service, the 60-day interim period will occur during the last two months of your six-month notice period to transfer to bundled service.

Once you are moved to TOU-8-CPP, you will receive bill protection for the first 12 months, effective on your next regularly-scheduled meter read date after moving to TOU-8-CPP. For more information about CPP, please visit www.sce.com/drp.

TOU-8 Rates: Flexible Pricing Based on Time-of-Use

If your business energy usage fluctuates during a normal 24-hour period, a TOU-8 rate may give you opportunities to get more out of your energy dollar.

TOU-8 rates are divided into three TOU periods: on-peak, mid-peak, and off-peak. TOU rates are further defined based on your voltage level: secondary, primary, or subtransmission. On-peak rates are higher than mid-peak and off-peak, while off-peak rates are lower than on-peak and mid-peak.
